The former will mainly do with aspects of problematic communication, and the latter with health matters of aged people, as contemporary society requires information literacy and care of the elderly. You will learn basic concepts and techniques of survey to grasp problems in real world, processing methods and interpretative strategies for gathered information (documents, data). At the end, you will come up with an original research project aiming at finding and solving problems of a real situation, then individually present it and critically discuss it to obtain opinions of others. In doing so, these seminar will provide you with the ability to imagine and consider matters that various stakeholders face before going to fieldwork.	Lectures are conducted in English. At the end, you will give a presentation of your project in public, preferably to people outside of the program (such as high school students, academic conference, public symposium, presentation session) to obtain critical feedbacks on your own project.
