Warning Statement after the Occurrence of Serial Terror Attacks in Paris

Safety-related information (spot information) is posted in the Ministry of Foreign Affairs (MOFA) website based on the current overseas situation (serial terror attacks in Paris).

In consideration of the situation noted above, when staying overseas or future travel is being considered, every effort should be made to access the latest information related to public safety, terrorism, etc. from the travel information, news reports, etc. released by MOFA such as staying current with information from news reports and the nearest Japanese Embassy or Consulate General to the place where you are staying or your destination, etc. to prevent being caught up in emergency situations such as abduction, assault, and terrorism.

Furthermore, before traveling to countries and regions other than France, for regions, etc. where the risk information has not been issued, please register for the overseas travel registration service being implemented by MOFA and keep yourself safe.
