• What are the University of Tsukuba's residence halls?

The residence halls were built with the intention of providing students with a superb learning environment while enabling them to experience living as independent members of the public.

Furthermore, since April 2016 the University started to run the Short Stay House, and from April 2017 the house-share-type Global Village, which focuses on international interaction and was built to encourage the internationalization of the campus.

• This is what make the residence halls so attractive!

- The rental costs are slightly lower than private apartments located in the vicinity (as the University pays the basic tariff for your utility costs you only have to pay the amount you actually use!)
- As they are located on-campus you are never far from where your next lecture will be held.
- You'll be living with other University of Tsukuba students so it's easy to make friends! You can make groups of friends regardless of your school or college!
- There's a residence halls festival (the Yadokari Festival) held each May, which provides a lively time for those entering

O How big are the residence halls?

The residence halls are the largest of any national university in Japan, with 3,821 rooms spread across four areas. In recent years, the older buildings were closed and Global Village was established to encourage the internationalization of the campus.

Reliable administration offices

The day-to-day management of the residence halls is conducted by administration offices that are located in each of the areas, and those living in the halls are welcome to speak with staff at any of the offices about any troubles they may be experiencing.

• Who can stay in the residence halls and for how long?

- Basically only students of the University of Tsukuba can move into the residence halls (students on leave of absence cannot in principle be accommodated)
- Consideration is paid towards accommodating in regular single rooms for students newly entering a school and overseas students on a prioritized basis. (A little over 40% of newly enrolling students move into the residence halls every year.)
- The type of room provided to students may vary according to student category, years of study at the University, room availability, time of moving in and so on. For further details, please consult the persons-in-charge of student residence halls in the Division of Student Welfare.
- Students are able to reside until March 31 of the academic year in which they move in (March 31 of the academic year after the year they move in in the case of the Global Village).
- Those wishing to continue to live in the residence halls after their term of occupancy expires must complete the application form by following the procedure explained on the notice posted at the end of October. When the occupancy quota is oversubscribed the applicants allotted accommodation will be decided by drawing lots. (Those who have not paid their residence charges and other requisite costs by the designated time will not be allowed to apply.)

[Security]

- Entrance security system

To protect residents and prevent crime, the security system is installed at the entrance of each residential building, PIN number security system in the OIKOSHI and HIRASUNA areas, IC tag system in the ICHINOYA and KASUGA areas. Only residents can enter the building.






