In the midwifery training program, students must acquire at least 61 credits, including 31 credits required to sit for the national midwifery certification examination. Examination of the results of research on a specific subject and passing the final examination may be substituted for examination of the master's thesis and passing the final examination.

[Graduation requirements]

Students must be enrolled in the program for at least two years, earn the prescribed credits by completing the coursework required for completion as specified by Master's Program in Nursing Science, receive the necessary research guidance, and pass the examination and final examination of their master's thesis or the results of their research on a specific topic. However, for those who have made outstanding achievements, it is sufficient for them to be enrolled for at least one year.

*If deemed educationally beneficial, credits earned by taking courses in other degree programs may be accepted as credits toward completion within the limit of 10 credits as determined by each degree program.
