(Completion Requirements)

Students must be enrolled in the program for at least three years, acquire at least 9 credits by taking the required courses as specified above table, receive necessary research supervision, and pass the Doctoral dissertation and the final examinations. However, for those who have made outstanding achievements, enrollment for at least one year is sufficient. (For those who have completed a master's program early, three years including the period of enrollment in the master's program).

- Attending the “Research Ethics Guidance” provided by Degree Programs in Humanities and Social Sciences is a requirement for completion of the program.
- To submit a certificate of completion of the e-learning course (eL-CoRE or eAPRIN [formerly CITI Japan]) at the time of application for preliminary doctoral dissertation review is a requirement for completion of the program.

(Note1) It is recommended that students take 1 credit from Degree Programs' Common Courses or Graduate General Education Courses.

(Note2) If deemed instrumental for educational purposes, with the approval of the Degree Program Education Committee, credits earned by taking courses in other degree programs, etc. may be accepted as requirements for completion, up to a maximum of 4 credits.

【Regarding the Japanese Language Teacher Training Program for the Degree Programs in Humanities and Social Sciences】

A "Certificate of Completion for the Japanese Language Teacher Training Program" will be issued by the Degree Programs in Humanities and Social Sciences to those who meet the following requirements by taking courses offered in the International and Advanced Japanese Studies Degree Program and similar programs. Enrolment is subject to the course requirements for the student's year of application (Students wishing to enroll in this program must first obtain the approval of their academic advisor regarding their enrollment in the program.)

- **Eligibility:** Students enrolled in the Degree Programs in Humanities and Social Sciences.
- **Completion requirements:** Students must earn a minimum of 31 credits by fulfilling the following four requirements.
